Brief Report

A WhatsApp group was created to monitor progress, provide guidance, and address difficulties faced by participants. Through this online platform, student volunteers and experts offered timely support, shared best practices, and fostered a sense of community among participants, contributing to the initiative's success. To support the sapling distribution, a pamphlet of instructions on sowing and raising vegetables was also distributed. This informative material provided valuable guidance for individuals looking to start their own organic gardens.

Student members of the Bhoomitrasena Club played a vital role in the program, providing awareness on the importance of organic farming and its benefits for human health and the environment. Through interactive sessions and displays, they highlighted the need to shift away from chemical-based farming practices and adopt more sustainable and eco-friendly methods.
